# A Welcome from the Chairman of TAFI Ulster Mr Darren Wallace.

I am delighted to formerly welcome all the teams taking part in the XVIII Commonwealth Fly Fishing Championship. from 31st Aug to the 8th Sep 2018 in Northern Ireland.

TAFI are the official representative of Ireland in International Trout Fly Fishing and is one of the founding members of the FIPS Mouche which is the fly fishing arm of CIPS the World regulating body for competitive fishing in all disciplines. CIPS fulfils the same function in fishing as the Olympic Council does in athletic sport.

TAFI organises angling competitions for youths and seniors every year across Ireland with the winners representing Ireland at the Four Nations Bank Competition (Ireland, England, Scotland, and Wales), European, Commonwealth and World Fly Fishing Championships. This event is been organised and hosted in Northern Ireland for the first time by the TAFI Ulster Angling Council.

The hosting of this prestigious event is the result of many years of dedicated voluntary work by TAFI members, both promoting senior and youth angling in Ireland and also sending teams to fish in the World and European Championships.

Our International FIPS-Mouche Representative is Mr Denis Cronin who has been lobbying other member countries and individuals over the last number of years to get a TAFI team into the Commonwealth Competitions.

Indeed the NI Team competed for the first time in Tasmania in 2012 gaining a creditable 3rd Team place and Individual runner up. In 2014 they again achieved a 3rd Team place and Individual runner up, They were just piped out of the same placing in Canada in 2016 finishing 4th in the Team event and gaining 5th and 6th Individual places.

This year the opening ceremony is being held in the Silverbirch Hotel, Omagh on Sunday 2nd Sep. The Silverbirch Hotel is the championship headquarters for the duration of the Competition.

Official practice will be held on Friday 31st Aug and Saturday 1st Sep followed by three days of competition fishing on 4th, 5th and 6th of Sep. Venues include two rivers and three lakes which are spread over the counties of Antrim, Tyrone and Londonderry.

The Silverbirch Hotel will also host the closing ceremony on Friday 7th Sep 2018 In addition a schools education day will be hosted by Angling NI, Loughs Agency and DAERA with conservation-orientated symposium on the same day. The Commonwealth Fly Tying and Fly Casting competitions will also be held at the Omagh Leisure Centre in parallel with the schools event..

Loughmacrory anglers were formed in 2009 and has since gone from strength to strength and grown into one of the top venues for visiting anglers from across the globe.

Woodford Fly Fishery can be found in tranquil settings, nestling in the shadow of the WW1 Knockagh Monument. Situated on the Woodburn Road, Carrickfergus.

It has been established for over 30 years, providing a service to the local community and visiting anglers from as far away as Europe, Australia, South Africa, America, Great Britain and all 4 corners of Ireland.

The Fly Lake is stocked with premium trout ranging from 1.5lb to 17lb in weight and also has a well stocked on-site tackle shop with fishing gear from Greys, JMC, Airflo, Wychwood, Rio and tying gear from Veniard, Flybox and Irish Fly Supplies.

The present proprietor, Darren Wallace, has been involved with the fishery for over 20 years both as a member and proprietor. Woodford is seen as a safe haven for junior anglers, who are encouraged and helped by the senior anglers to learn and develop their fishing skills because if you teach a child to fish you have given them a skill for life, which gives the kids an extra focus for their free time.

#### **Quiggery River (Finore Anglers Association)**

#### DENNETT RIVER

The Burn Dennett River often referred to just as "The Dennett" is a small to medium sized river. The source of the river starts in the Sperrin Mountains in County Tyrone and flows in a N-W direction until it reaches the village of Donemana, where it flows North West into the River Foyle.

Dennett Anglers Association Donemana, Co. Tyrone has 15miles, (24km) of both banks fishing. The river is perhaps best known for its sea trout, which are at their peak from June to August.

Brown trout are best fished for in June and July as a spate is fining down. Tackle shop in nearby town of Strabane. Nearest /Village: Donemana (*Dunamanagh*).

How to get there: Near the village of Donemana (*Dunamanagh*) and the main Londonderry/Strabane Road. Season: 20th May – 20th October.

Methods: Fly, spinning, worm. Best Flies: Sedges, Klinkhammers, Hawthorn Flies, Large dark olives,



Iron blue dun, Small dark olives Nymphs & General May fly patterns, May – June.

Permit: An unlimited number of day tickets.




Alan R McDade, Captain



I was privileged to be the Chairman / Organiser of Commonwealth Fly Fishing Championship 2010 - Wales. Its safe to say the Commonwealth Fly Fishing Championship is close to my heart and I try my best to give back to the sport what I have been fortunate to receive out of it along with the friendship made with anglers all over the world.



#### **History of the Commonwealth Fly Fishers.**

The idea for a Commonwealth Fly Fishing Championship originated during discussions amongst members of some of the Commonwealth teams attending the successful World Fly Fishing Championships held at Kimbridge (then the home of Anne & Arthur Humbert), on the River Test in England in May 1987.

Competitors from Australia, Canada and New Zealand approached Anne and Arthur Humbert with the idea that there should be a separate, simpler competition than the more formal FIPS-Mouche WFFC. They proposed that is should be based on the simple idea that "friendship in fishing" was more im-

portant than just competing to win.

The idea was enthusiastically supported by the Commonwealth teams present at that WFFC. Arthur Humbert and Tony Paulson agreed to take the idea forward It was, from the beginning, designed to provide a counterpoint to the more serious and formal. World Fly Fishing Championships (WFFC) and to foster a deep sense of friendly competition, fair play and fun amongst fly fishers from the Commonwealth family of nations. An organisation called "Commonwealth Fly Fishers" together with a set of rules and protocols for a championship was defined by Arthur & Tony.

Many of the initial proposals and technical advice on defining a suitable format was provided by Tony Pawson, the experienced English Captain. And so the "Commonwealth Fly Fishers" was born. Rule 1 of the original rules states "Rules and organisation should be kept simple, the twin aims are enjoyable fishing and companionship and a chance to sample each other's waters and methods. The results to be secondary to these aims". Although the rules have been modified since this time, this idea is still the underlying philosophy of the CFFC. Anne and Arthur, with these aims in mind, arranged to hold the inaugural Championships with the enormous support and co-operation of Jason and Barbara Garrett at London Lakes Lodge, Tasmania in December 1988. Six teams from Australia, Canada, England, New Zealand, Scotland and Wales participated together with a celebrity team. This was a great success so the decision was taken to make this a regular event. The Humberts had a logo, flag etc designed for "The Commonwealth Fly Fishers" as the organisation was to be known.

The name was a deliberate choice to emphasise that the membership was open to all fly fishers of either sex. Together these helped to formalise the organisation and to provide a link between each event. It was also decided that this competition should normally be held in the Commonwealth country closest to the annual World Fly Fishing Championships location. When this was not practicable, the competition would not be held that year. In the late 1990s it was agreed by the representatives of each team then present that the competition would be held every second (even numbered) year unless the FIPS Mouche competition was actually in a Commonwealth country in the intervening year in which case an additional CFFC would be held. From the beginning, the founders were committed to the idea that this Commonwealth Fly Fishing competition would be free from the "politics & formality" associated with the FIPS-Mouche world fly fishing championships, It now lives on in this wonderful biannual event as a friendly, international, fishing competition which we now take forward under the slogan, "Fishing in Friendship". The basic idea that attendees would get to meet other like minded fly fishers and form lasting friendships has turned out to be one of the best features of this competition. It has enabled many of the participants to travel the Commonwealth, fishing with like minded colleagues locally. The inaugural winners received a magnificent perpetual trophy donated by Jason Garrett Snr. Australia won

the first Championship and handsome piscatorial prizes were presented to the medal winning team members. Many successful events have taken place since; England hosted the Championship in 1989, Wales in 1990, with generous sponsorship from Welsh Water, New Zealand 1991 in Rotorua in conjunction with the WFFC, Canada in 1993 following the WFFC in Kamloops, and Scotland in 1995 at Kinross. 1997 was held? (let us know if anyone remembers such a championship). This was followed in 1999 by a CFFC organised by Ballarat Fly Fishers on behalf of Fly Fish Australia (FFA). In 2000 the CFFC was held in England at Rutland Water following the WFFC. In 2002 the Welsh Salmon & Trout Association again hosted the CFFC based in Llangothlan. In 2003 an unofficial CFFC was held at Pitsford and Rutland Waters with Bob Church as host. In 2004 we held an official CFFC on Loch Fitty in Dunfermline, Scotland. Following this, in 2006 the competition was held in Wales on the River Dee and Lyn Brenig reservoir. 2008 was held in NZ in Hawkes Bay mainly on the Tukituki River following the WFFC in Rotorua. 2009 was held in Scotland on the Island of Islay as the WFFC was also in Scotland that year. The 2010 CFFC was again held in Wales at Rhayader & Llandrindod. 2012 saw a hugely successful (and the largest to date) CFFC in Tasmania hosted by FFA and organised by Malcolm Crosse.

2014 was organised in Devon by Dave Grove of the Commonwealth Fly Fishers of England. 2016 was held in Canada at Mont-Tremblant, Quebec, in August just prior to the WFFC in the Vale, Colorado, USA. It was organised by Fly Fishing Canada under their President, Jim Iredale and Organiser, Alain Monast. The September 2018 CFFA will be held in Northern Ireland under the auspices of TAAFI, with Alan Mc Dade as the international Organiser In 1995 at the AGM during the CFFC held at Kinross, Scotland, Arthur Humbert announced his decision to stand down as Chairman. He proposed that Jill Mandeno from New Zealand assume the Chairmanship, which was duly agreed by the attendees. Bob Church was also appointed as Technical Advisor, replacing Tony Pawson.

And so after firmly establishing the CFFC as a permanent fixture on the fishing calendar, the Humbert's relinquished the reins of the CFA and passed the management into the hands of Jill Mandeno who remains Chairman today. The CFFC has evolved over the years. An AGM is held in conjunction with each championship following the Captains Meeting. The Team Captains are the designated representatives of each country present.

Changes to the rules and format are discussed and voted on at these meetings. In the late 1990s it was agreed that each Commonwealth Country would as of right be able to enter one team of men, women or mixed anglers. If space permitted, they would also be able to enter a second team as well. Preference for the entry of a second team would be given to those countries which operate their men's and women's fly fishing separately. In this case one woman's team and one men's team would be allowed. Any additional available places for second teams will be available to any member on a first come, first served basis. In order to provide the same fishing rules as anglers must adhere to at world level, the competition is now conducted under the latest published international FIPS Mouche fishing rules (with the only changes being rules modifications to meet local laws). However non-fishing rules relating to the formalities associated with that event are used at the discretion of the local organising committee. We continue to emphasise the need to bring together friends old and new, sharing a common understanding and reaffirming again that old adage "there's more to fishing than catching fish". In line with our slogan, Jason Garrett's trophy has been renamed "The Friendship Trophy" and is now considered the top award at the CFFC. It is unique in that the winner is decided by all the teams present with each team having one vote (for other than themselves!) for the team they perceive as best exhibiting the ideals of the CFA.

Over the years there have been some truly worthy winners with the 2012 winners being the novice fly fishing team from Kiribati attending their first such event.

Sadly some of our founders are no longer with us. The CFA first lost Tony Pawson, then Arthur Humbert, first Chairman of the Commonwealth Fly Fishers, passed away on Thursday, October 13th 2011 after a long illness. Fortunately both Anne Humbert and Jason Garrett Snr are still associated with the CFA as we move forward, to an enlarged organisation with new member countries and a new, younger generation of anglers.

In 2014, the name "Commonwealth Flyfishers Association" was formerly registered in the UK with Jill Mandeno as its Director. Dave Grove & Malcolm Crosse were formally appointed Secretary and VP respectively. The society is a registered "not for-profit" organisation. In order to keep this name and status of the society, from 2016 a small annual membership fee will be introduced to cover the filing of annual tax returns, registration etc. This will be fixed at the 2016 AGM.

Membership is open to only one registered sports fly fishing organisation in each Commonwealth country. First right to join will be made to the society who is the registered member of FIPS-Mouche. Where this organisation is not interested in belonging to the Commonwealth Fly Fishers, interested anglers in that country may formally register another society and apply for membership. Once a country representative society has joined, it can only be replaced if it resigns in favour of another society.

The society now comprises representatives from:

- Australia, Fly Fish Australia.
- Canada, Fly Fishing Canada England.
- Commonwealth Fly Fishing England.
- Isle of Man, Isle of Man Fly Fishermen.
- Malta, National Federation of Sports Anglers in Malta.
- New Zealand, Sport Fly Fishing NZ Inc.
- Northern Ireland, Trout Angling Federation of Ireland.
- Scotland, Commonwealth Fly Fishing Scotland.
- South Africa, South Africa Fly Fishing Association.
- Wales, Welsh Salmon & Trout Association.
- Channel Islands, Channel Islands Federation of Freshwater Anglers.

A number of other Commonwealth nations have expressed interested in joining the society and it is hoped that CFF can be a catalyst for increasing sports fly fishing throughout the Commonwealth.

DAERA Inland Fisheries is responsible, under the provisions of the Fisheries Act (NI) 1966, for the salmon and inland fisheries of Northern Ireland and provides advice and guidance on the conservation, protection, development and improvement of salmon and inland fisheries to angling clubs, fishery owners and a range of other stakeholders. It is the licensing authority for angling in Northern Ireland, other than the Foyle and Carlingford areas which are covered by the Loughs Agency.

Inland Fisheries manages the DAERA Public Angling Estate, which provides citizens with accessible, affordable and good quality angling. It offers game and coarse fishing at a range of rivers, lakes and canals across Northern Ireland and features some renowned venues such as Lough Erne and the River Bush at Bushmills. A significant number of waters have disabled facilities such as enhanced access and designated fishing stands. The Department runs a major fish farm at Movanagher on the Lower Bann near Kilrea, which provides in excess of 120000 brown and rainbow trout for stocking in Public Angling Estate put and take fisheries. This also has a conservation effect, alleviating angling pressure on wild fish stocks.

In recent years DAERA Inland Fisheries has developed an Angling Community Outreach strategy, which aims to increase participation in angling, particularly from underrepresented groups such as children and young people, females and those with disabilities. In the last year the Department has supported a range of events that have provided over 2000 individuals with their first angling experience. The health and well-being effect of angling is well documented and the Community Outreach Team has worked with groups from the education sector, the criminal justice system and charities, which use angling as a vehicle to address a wide range of issues.

#### LOUGHS AGENCY



**The Loughs Agency** is one of six "North / South Implementation Bodies" set up under the Belfast Agreement. It operates across both jurisdictions (Northern Ireland and the Republic of Ireland) and is a key body in the management and conservation of inland fisheries in the Foyle and Carlingford regions, developing and promoting the game, coarse and sea angling product of these two cross border catchments.

The Foyle system covers an area of approximately 1,300 square miles stretching across much of three counties. The tributaries of the Foyle rise in the Blue Stack Mountains of Donegal, the Sperrin Mountains of Tyrone and Derry and the wildness of Inishowen – hills that hold many of the spawning waters of Foyle salmon.

These rivers provide the most affordable sport in these islands for a broad range of anglers. As well as fabulous salmon fishing, the Foyle system offers excellent sport for the brown trout angler. Sea trout anglers can get cracking sport out of good runs of sea trout from mid July onwards on most of the Foyle rivers.

The Carlingford system covers an area of approximately 340 square miles. The rivers that run into Carlingford Lough rise in the Mourne Mountains of County Down, the Cooley Mountains of County Louth and Slieve Gullion in County Armagh - hills that hold quality spawning waters.

The fishing in the Carlingford catchment offers wide variety: sea trout anglers can get cracking sport out of good runs from mid July onwards on the Whitewater River; there is some great trout fishing in the rivers and lakes; there is salmon to be had; the canal and some of the lakes offer coarse and pike fishing; and, there is superb sea angling from shore or charter boat!


